Ethics

• Definition of business ethics:

It is about managing ethics in an organizational context and involves applying principles and standards that guide behavior in business conduct. It applies to all aspects of business practices—from how organizations develop, produce, and deliver products and services, to interactions with customers, suppliers, employees, and society. It encompasses human rights; labor and employment practices, such as training, diversity, gender equality, and employee health and well-being; and bribery and corruption. (*International Federation of Accountants*)

• Examples of ethics concerns:

- Conflict of Interest
- Theft and embezzlement
- Bribery and kickbacks
- Falsification of documents
- Violation of company policy and law and regulations
